Membership Information

Panda Bowmen offers membership in 4 categories. Applications should be made using the appropriate form.

Senior full member

- Affiliates to Archery GB, NCAS and YAA through Panda Bowmen.
- Receives a key to the target store in October when membership has been renewed.
- May agree with others to shoot at any time the field is available.
- Participates in running the club through the Annual General Meeting and/or committee meetings.
- Eligible for election to the committee.

Disabled full member

- Affiliates to Archery GB, NCAS and YAA through Panda Bowmen.
- Receives a key to the target store in October when membership has been renewed.
- May agree with others to shoot at any time the field is available.
- Participates in running the club through the Annual General Meeting and/or committee meetings.
- Eligible for election to the committee.

Junior member

- Affiliates to Archery GB, NCAS and YAA through Panda Bowmen.
- May shoot at any time when at least one full member is shooting.

Senior associate member

- Affiliates to Archery GB, NCAS and YAA through another archery club.
- Application will only be accepted by a committee member on sight of a current Archery GB membership card.
- May shoot at any time when at least one full member is shooting.
- Responsible to ensure scores of all rounds are recorded by all clubs for handicap purposes

Shooting times

General practice evenings arranged by two or more members. No fixed start or finish times. Tuesday and Thursday mornings arriving at 9.30am to start shooting about 10am.

Saturday is tournament day. Shooting will usually start at 1pm, an earlier start may be advertised for a longer round. A round will either be advertised in advance or agreed by those present at 12.45pm. All rounds shot to be scored and scores submitted to the club Records Officer.

Dress code

On Saturday tournament days archers are expected to wear a club shirt or otherwise follow the Archery GB dress regulations:

307. Dress Regulations

- (a) The recognised dress of Archery GB is plain dark green and/or white.
- (b) Footwear that fully encloses the toes and front of the foot must be worn at all times when shooting.
- (c) Members of Archery GB shooting and officiating at tournaments granted UK or World Record Status by Archery GB are required to wear clothing that is appropriate, clean, in good condition (ie not frayed or worn, either deliberately or by use) and conventional in style and appearance.
In particular:
 - (i) Tops or shirts must cover the front and back of the body (including the midriff when at full draw), they must not be strapless and, for gentlemen, must include sleeves.
 - (ii) Any colour garments may be worn with the exception of blue denim, olive drab and camouflage pattern.
 - (iii) Badges, Logos and Wording.
 - a. Clothing manufacturers' trademarks are allowed. The wearer's name is allowed.
 - b. Individuals, and members of clubs and other archery organisations that are commercially sponsored may wear sponsors' logos and names during the sponsorship period only.
 - c. Other wording or badges on clothing must represent archery organisations.
- (iv) Members of Archery GB who are officiating as the Chairman of Judges, Judge or Director of Shooting at a UK or World Record Status tournament shall wear Archery GB recognised Judges official dress.
- (v) A member of Archery GB who has represented Great Britain (GBR) as an archer at an international tournament may wear their international shooting uniform for the remainder of that season and the following one.

Data Protection

When you become a member of, or renew your membership with Panda Bowmen, the Club Secretary will hold the information you have provided for the sole purpose of managing the club and your membership.

We will hold your data while you are an active member of the club, the membership lists will be reviewed in September of each year. Should you choose not to renew your membership at this time, your data will be removed from our lists within 6 months of all club trophies and keys being returned. Please note Panda Bowmen uses an email list to contact all members, your email address will be hidden from other club members. In addition a WhatsApp group of adult members is used to discuss shooting arrangements.

As a member you will automatically be registered as a member of Archery GB, Yorkshire Archery Association and Northern Counties Archery Society. The County and Region will have limited read only permissions to your membership details and Archery GB will have full access to enable the organisations to effectively administer the sport.

We will provide Archery GB with your personal data which they will use to enable access to an online portal for you (<https://agb.sport80.com>) which, amongst other things, allows you to set and amend your privacy settings. If you have any questions about the continuing privacy of your personal data when it is shared with Archery GB, please contact gdpr@archerygb.org .

The Club Records Officer will record your name and details of your shooting (bow style, round, date, score) to maintain your handicap and classification. When you achieve a club record score that will be published within the club and on the website. Your name will remain on the list of club records until another archer exceeds your record, possibly many years after you are no longer an active member of Panda Bowmen. Some club records have stood for over 20 years.
